PREPARING TO PLAY—TRUE OR FALSE ?

Who can doubt that in pre-historic times man and his sons went out on walks picked up large stones and threw them at targets. Certainly there is ample evidence of ball and target games being played some 4 000 years BC. Evolution is a slow process so not until the thirteenth century is there any sure record of trundling large bowls at targets placed at the far end of a flat area of grass; playing bowls as we know it today. The object was to deliver one's bowls nearer to the target than the opponents. The oldest existing green is at South Hampton and, it dates back to 1299. This was a somewhat subtler game than the parallel and popular pastime; skittles. Legend has it that the highly refined and constantly growing international game LAWN BOWLS - the word "lawn" is not used in British Isles - came into being through chance during the sixteenth century. Charles Brandon, the Duke of Suffolk, is reputed to have been contesting an exciting game when he delivered a bowl with such force that it shattered into several pieces. Always a man of resource, he rushed indoors in search of a substitute. His quickly scanning eyes took in the decorative stairway and banisters which ended in a large, ornamental ball. Calling for a handsaw, he soon separated it from its fixing ad took it outside to resume play. However, in cutting it free the saw had flattened one side of the sphere, so setting up an imbalance that resulted in it travelling in a curve instead of the customary straight line of a perfect sphere. Alert of mind and skilled in performance, he exploited this imbalance - in Lawn Bowls it is called "bias". (from the book : HOW TO PLAY BOWLS by James Medlycot) (Available at our book club)

**Keith Scott**, Trust Officer, explains how tax can be claimed back on a Capital Gain (with certain limitations).

#### **X RETIREMENT ANNUITY CONTRIBUTIONS AND CAPITAL GAINS TAX**

The question is often asked whether you can claim tax back on a Capital Gain by contributing to a retirement annuity. The simple answer is yes, you can claim against the portion of the Capital Gain which is included in your Taxable Income. However, your deduction is limited to your taxable income (or remuneration) excluding capital gains.

To clarify this with an example:

If you earn R1,000 in taxable income, made up of R500 in taxable income (or remuneration) and R500 in taxable capital gain, you will be allowed a maximum deduction of 27.5%, or R275, of the total R1,000 as the 27.5% is less than your remuneration of R500.



However, if your R1,000 taxable income consists of R100 from remuneration and R900 from a taxable capital gain, you will be entitled to the maximum deduction of 27.5% but you may only daim R100 for that particular year. The difference between your retirement contribution and the amount claimed will be carried forward and can be deducted from your taxable income (excluding any capital gains) in future tax years.

#### • MR SMOOTH

Silky smooth delivery that purrs away. Has complete control at delivery and just needs to focus to dominate the game.

#### THE MACHINE

So repetitive he is almost boring but envied by all other bowlers. One dimensional but hard to beat. Probably played quoits as a youngster.

#### THE FLICKER

Not relaxed and doesn't feel the bowls with the fingers rather bowling from the wrist. Unpredictable amount of flick or turn so plays only half a good game. Hard to add weight and the flick puts bowls onto the wrong line.

#### THE DUMPER

Usually dumped out of the pennant side. Poor flexibility, disability or lazy on delivery. Bouncing bowls lose momentum and have unpredictable draw. Must be remembering the days of skipping stones on the water!

#### THE POKER

Related to the pusher, looking for the conversion and usually just misses!! Not the best team player doing this all the time. Lacks confidence with the draw shot probably due to poor weight control.

#### THE CALCULATOR

A very careful player and analytical. Plays and loves percentages so much he gets distracted from the main game. Generally, sits by himself with all his friends!


#### THE STONKER
